NOTE: the last 10% of a dam's water is difficult to use, the useable water in the dam is approximately 10% less than the dam level.

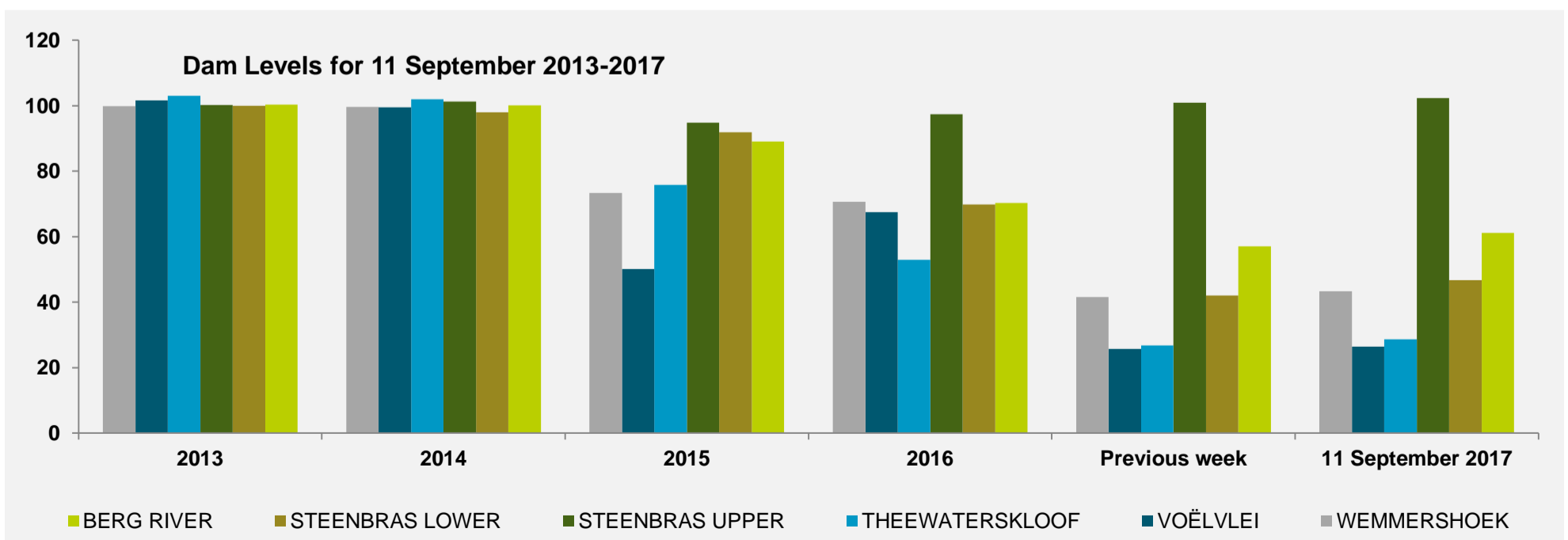

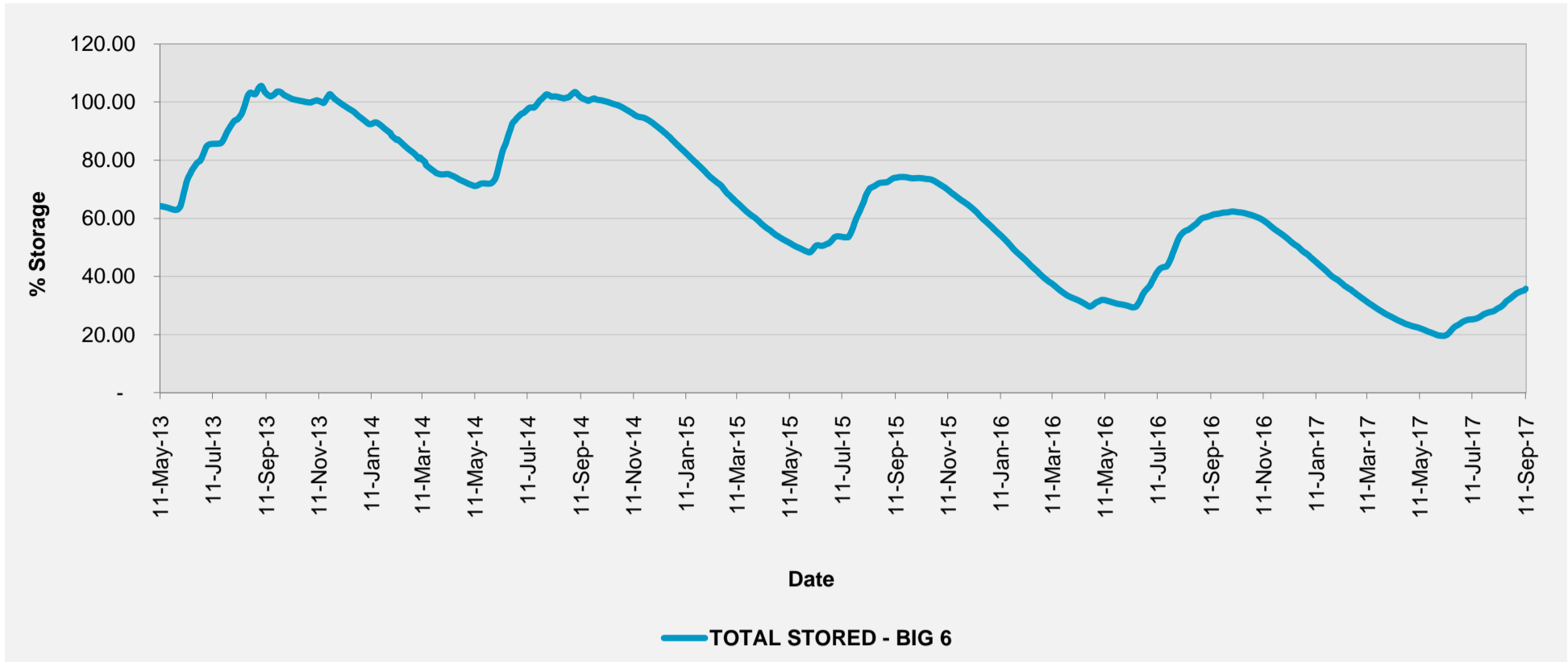

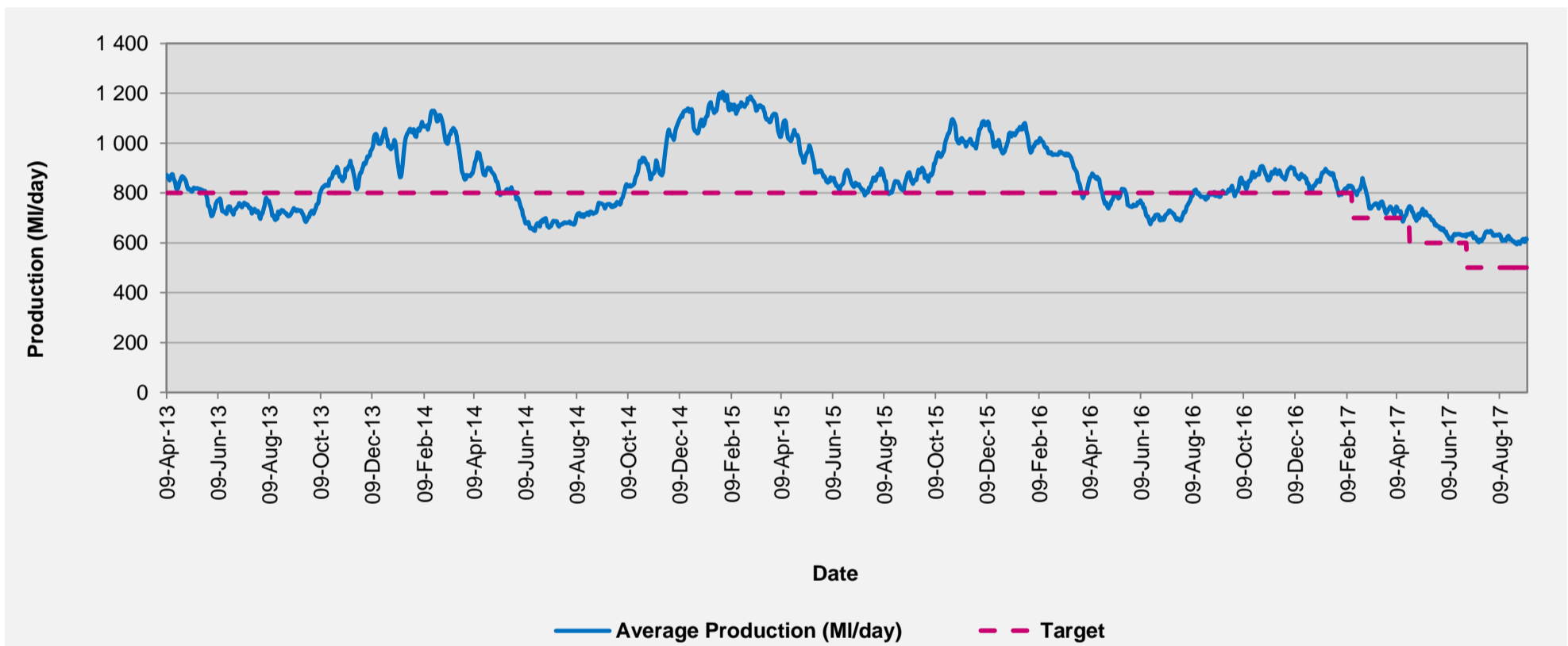
